We use our Bank Worker system as a top up during busy periods, but also to offer regular hours when we can. Zero hours contracts work really well in this situation, giving Bank Workers the option to choose when they do (and don't) want to work.

It's wonderful to be able to offer Louise this paid opportunity, and in her first few weeks with us she has proven to be reliable and productive, meeting the needs of the business with a smile on her face!

I'm pleased to be working with my co-workers and feel like I am part of the team. The work makes me feel valued. I've enjoyed learning new things and improving my skills and hope to learn more things in the future.

To have all four colleagues join the ranks of our learners with distinctions is fabulous news and very well deserved. The Level 5 is a particularly difficult course of learning and is equivalent to a Higher National Diploma (HND) or the first two years of a Batchelors Degree, so getting a distinction is no mean feat.

It's also worth noting that Belinda, Abigail and Adam have made it a clean sweep of distinctions for the PAS North Management Team! Well done everyone.

IM's apprenticeship providers, Connect2Care, tell us we have had 14 Level 5 learners over the past seven years. Seven of these have passed with distinction, five have passed with merits, and two were straight passes. To have half of our learners achieve at this level is a credit to both them and to IM.
