Introducing paid opportunities for our customers

Earlier this year a small Working Together committee was formed to talk about and implement a positive new approach to our County Working Together Board (CWTB).

It was important to us that the CWTB would provide paid opportunities for customers. This makes sure everyone is equally represented, through having a voice and being paid for their contribution.

We secured an agreement for customers to receive a discretionary payment of £11.50/hour for their time spent on the Board.

The customer Board member roles were advertised across IM during the summer and customers invited to apply.

We received 8 applications for the 3 roles and invited 5 candidates to interview.

Interviews took place during October with members in place for first meeting to take place in early November 2024.


Zaking Together

Customers at Attleborough Hub are learning French thanks to colleagues Helen and David. The sessions are led by David who speaks fluent French.



#### **TAPS** wildlife blog

Hi everyone TAPS wildlife team here!
Back in the summer National Trust ranger
Ben visited us at the Hub. He gave an
interesting talk and arranged for us to
make some decoy birds for them to use at
Blakeney Point.

These are made from modelling clay and need to be an even size and shape, to mimic a little tern nesting. Once dry, they are painted to look like the real thing!

Well at the beginning of September we visited the reserve at Blakeney to hand them over to Ben. The decoys will be used to help guide little terns to safer nesting sites. Ben was really pleased with them and will be putting them out next year.

We were then treated to a wonderful fun filled day with our very own guide Carl, a former ranger who now works as a volunteer. Carl had been a ranger alongside Ajay Tegala who is now a Countryfile and Springwatch presenter. Claire had read all about Carl in Ajay's book so it was nice to put a face to a name.

Adorned with our National Trust lanyards, we started with a walk and talk at Friary Hills where Carl told us all about gall wasps and how they lay eggs at the ends of oak trees creating these round hard berry-like deposits with the eggs inside. We were all fascinated by this!

We then went pond dipping at a small river of water called a barnet where Carl found us a lovely array of pond life including eels, which he really wanted us to see. He told us how eels come all the way from their breeding place in the Sargasso Sea in the North Atlantic and travel via Scotland to end up at Blakeney. An American gentleman with a dog stopped to listen and asked if American eels were the same as our eels.

Apparently, the American eels have two less vertebrate. European eels are called Anguilla and American eels are Rostrata. It was so interesting to hear that when both types leave the Sargasso Sea, the Europeans go one way and the Americans the other. Now how clever is that?! In late October these wriggly little creatures make the long journey back, eels can live up to 30 years. Wow!!!

Carl also showed us the reeds which are used to make thatched roofs and the rushes and to remember the difference 'rushes for brushes'.

Stephen took one of each home.

We walked back for our picnic lunch with Ben where Carl had to leave after a huge thank you from us all. He has offered to take us out again next spring so we can't wait!

After lunch we walked down to the quay with Ben and up to the viewpoint where we looked out to sea, so peaceful and beautiful. Sadly, the day went too fast, and it was time for us to return. We couldn't thank Ben and Carl enough for making us so welcome and making our day so special. Ben and the rangers are going to look for more ways we can help in the future. One very exciting project could be on the horizon, but more about that another time, as it's still in the planning stages.

If you've never visited Blakeney it's well worth a trip to see the wonderful work that the National Trust does to keep it a haven for our precious wildlife. Until next time, keep an eye out for the autumn migrants coming in for the winter and keep watching wildlife and help where you can.

Being part of the main team in the factory can be a lot for people to cope with, whilst packing is individual work and can be undertaken in a quieter space.

We have struggled recently to find reliable contract packing work which has resulted in us calling people off work placements.

We are hopeful the tradeshow will help put some new packing work our way. This will benefit those currently on work placements and means we can continue to support even more people looking to move closer to employment.

If you know of anyone who has packing work they need doing, please put them in touch. We will have a go at most things; collating, stuffing envelopes, packing hampers, splitting down bulk goods into smaller packs, shrink wrapping, boxing etc. but we are unable to do any packing which involves direct contact with food.


They are expanding their range to include small animal paper bedding and have chosen to support Norfolk Industries by promoting 8 of ownbranded products across a range of online platforms.

East Norfolk Sixth Form College invited HSM's training and development team to take part in a two-day 'immersive' workshop event, delivering dementia awareness sessions to students.

The event took place on 24th and 25th September and was attended by Year 10 students from high schools across Great Yarmouth and Lowestoft, and the college's Year 1 T-level health students.

The HSM coaches delivered eight sessions across the two days, ending each with a five-minute talk on the rewards of working in the social care sector, and how it can be a stepping stone into related occupations.

Feedback from students indicated the dementia awareness session was the most popular. The coaches were approached by the deputy head teacher from Pakefield High School in Lowestoft, asking if they could deliver dementia awareness training sessions to pupils at the school and give a talk on the Health and Social Care sector and job roles.

# A fabulous day out at Gressenhall

On 10th September colleagues Claire, Sue and Howie took their history group to visit Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse.

The whole group fell in love with the Suffolk punch horses, which were beautiful. The farm has five of these lovely horses, which are believed to be the oldest breed of heavy horse in Britain, and are now an endangered species, with only around 500 left.

Everyone enjoyed a tractor ride to visit and feed horses Reggie and Casper, which was the highlight of Justin's and Martyn's day. We are very lucky to have them at Gressenhall.

We learnt how they are used to plough the fields just like they would have done years ago. Everyone got their height checked using the special measuring stick used on the horses, which measures in 'hands'. Only Ollie and Stephen were declared the full Reggie at 16 hands!

On Friday October 4th The Studio Gang took a trip out to Hunstanton for a visit to the sea life centre.








Maria was nominated for the Collaboration / Co-production in Care category for her work with customers and the Working Together Groups.

They received some very generous gifts which will go all to PACT animal sanctuary.








