With support from colleagues, PAS North customer Jason has secured a voluntary job, which is a huge step for him!



That didn't quite happen, but thank you to David for taking us all back to the good old days 😁 🔅



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




Tasty food, drink and shared games played a big part in the week's activities. Customers enjoyed several pub/bar days, and the Hub had its very own glamourous barmaid!

Pamper Sessions are a popular new addition to the weekly timetable at Dereham Community Hub.



Jason's blog!


Hello everyone, Jason here with a longawaited blog, hooray they say!

Everyone taking part had a fantastic time and enjoyed taking part in the shoots. We can't wait to share the finished video!




